Advocacy Day is an opportunity for you and other passionate people to meet virtually with members of Congress urging them to support policies that improve the lives of individuals and families facing hereditary cancers. Our 2022 agenda will focus on legislative efforts that facilitate affordable access to care (genetic counseling, testing, screening, preventive interventions and treatments). Reducing barriers to these crucial services saves lives!

Your voice is the most powerful tool for raising awareness on Capitol Hill, and the more we join together to speak out, the greater our impact will be.

Advocates from around the U.S. are needed—hereditary cancer survivors, previvors, family members, healthcare professionals and researchers.
