

How to Find Out What Type of Breast Implant You Have

Allergan is recalling its **BIOCELL textured breast implant products**, including:

- Natrelle Saline-Filled breast implants,
- Natrelle Silicone-Filled breast implants,
- Natrelle Inspira Silicone-Filled breast implants, and
- Natrelle 410 Highly Cohesive Anatomically Shaped Silicone-Filled breast implants.

The recall also includes tissue expanders used prior to breast augmentation or reconstruction, including:

- Natrelle 133 Plus Tissue Expander
- Natrelle 133 Tissue Expander with Suture Tabs

Not sure if you have Allergan BIOCELL breast implants?

- As with any implanted device, it is good to keep a record of the device manufacturer, unique device identifier, and implant model name. You should have received this information on a patient device card provided by your surgeon.
- If you did not receive or cannot find your device card(s), your first step is to contact your surgeon or request the record of your surgery (operative notes) from the hospital where it was performed.

If your surgeon and/or hospital are not able to provide you with information about your implants...

- Women receiving implants typically have the opportunity to “opt in” to a device manufacturer registry or database by providing certain information at the time of surgery. If you opted in, Allergan may be able to search its database to determine the type of implant(s) you have.
